- 1. <u>Scottish Ambulance Service, Paper GPSub\_47</u>
- The response from the Scottish Ambulance Service was considered.
- The SAS has outlined that it will triage calls from patients
- The SAS needs to consider its expectations of general practice, which is not an emergency service. It is important that the patient pathways as described in the letter received are adhered to.
- Calls from GP practices bypass the SAS' triage system.
- Members raised concerns about specific examples of problems with ambulances attending to their patients.
- It is important that practices provide direct feedback to the SAS where they have concerns about the service
- The GP Subcommittee will continue to monitor the interface between general practice and SAS and any instances of unagreed pathways being introduced.


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• The sit rep is relatively stable but shows a continuously challenging picture for practices.

# **MINUTES**

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- 4. <u>NHS GGC Winter Plan, Papers GPSub\_50 and GPSub\_51</u>
- The health board has approved its winter plan.
- The GP Subcommittee's secretariat had raised concerns whilst the document was still being written about the process of creating the plan, as well as its contents noting that there was nothing of substance to support general practice.
- The GP Subcommittee was deeply disappointed by the lack of focus on general practice within the winter plan and of the view that this was not a plan to support whole system working within NHSGGC nor did it recognise the accelerated demand and capacity gap, which is anticipated to develop over the winter months inevitably impacting on patient care..
- The importance of public messaging which emphasises responsible use of general practice as a frontline service and not just ED was noted.
- The health board committed to taking on board the comments from members.
- 5. Role of General Practice in Public Health Cases
- The office was recently contacted by a practice following it being requested by public health to undertake swabs and prescribe antibiotics for a household contact of a patient with diphtheria.
- There is no agreed pathway for how household contacts should access swabs/antibiotics.
- Public health has stated that it has no resource to undertake this.
- The GP Subcommittee is of the view that this is not the role of general practice and that public health stating that it does not have the resources for this does not mean that this work should fall onto general practice.
- This will be discussed at the Primary Care Clinical Advisory Group, and the GP Subcommittee's secretariat has also requested a bilateral meeting with public health.
